
WHO WE ARE: OUR LEADERSHIP



HOW WE DO THIS: OUR CORE VALUES

We build our ministry on five key values that guide our approach to leading students.



Identity - The Label You Accept

Our true identity is found in Jesus. We are not defined by our mistakes, our image, or what others say about us. We hold fast to the label He gives us, avoiding the traps of feeling like we're not enough. We embrace the truth that we are fully known, deeply loved, and chosen by God.

Compass — The Direction You Follow

We are guided and directed by Christ, not culture. We work hard to study, grasp, and apply Scripture. We stand firm on the truth of the Bible. We hold on to what's right, call out what's false, and respond with both truth and love. We are examiners and critics of popular culture, not mere consumers of it.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR SPIRITUAL GROWTH

Our goal is to provide spiritual growth opportunities that build the foundation of Christian discipleship in your child. Here's how that takes shape at Current Students.





Junior High - 9:30A | High School - 11:00A

The Ascent is a Sunday Bible Study that is specifically geared toward Junior High and High School Students at their respective times. The Current Students team leads an interactive examination of God's Word in an open group format. This isn't the typical school lecture, but a creative presentation of Biblical truth along with interactive discussion.

Mid-Week



Wednesdays - 6:30 PM - When School is In-Session

Basecamp is a time for students to participate in peer-led worship, receive Biblical life-application teaching from staff and adult leaders, and spend some time in a small-group atmosphere where the lesson really comes alive. And, there's never any shortage of fun and excitement on Wednesday nights!

Communion

In keeping with our church's overall practices, we do not have a formal set of requirements for communion. Most families have their child begin taking communion after baptism. Again, we encourage you to keep this an open conversation in your home. Generally speaking, it's our belief that communion is for the baptized believer.

Since we strongly encourage families to attend the 9:30 or 11:00 a.m. service together, we operate under the assumption that students are taking communion with you in church. We believe that this is the most reverent and best environment for us to partake in the Lord's Supper.

However, for those students who wish to participate in communion who are not attending the worship service on Sunday morning, communion will be available in The Summit. Comment end

Baptism

Like Communion, we do not have a formal set of requirements for baptism. We encourage you to keep this an open conversation with your child. We believe that you are the best person to decide when they are ready.

When a student is ready to become a Christian, our leadership team will be happy to have conversations with your child regarding the weight of the decision and the details of what the Bible teaches about baptism. The Bible prescribes a sense of urgency when a person is ready for baptism—but not a sense of emergency. Parents are always included in this process.

Special Events

Your student can look forward to several special events throughout the year. Many of them take place during Basecamp on Wednesday nights. Our goal is to make available a variety of experiences ranging from just plain fun to meaningful service-related events. We share a calendar each semester with all the details.



BEING A TWO-HOUR FAMILY

It is our strong encouragement that your family commits to both service hours (9:30 & 11:00 a.m.) each Sunday morning. At the core of this sentiment lies our belief that once youth reach student ministry ages, it is best for them to attend the main church service with their family. In other words, Current Students ministry opportunities are not intended to take the place of the church body coming together on Sundays.

We believe families should worship together, pray together, take communion together, and be under the same preaching together. The benefits of this are numerous.

Statistical research shows that students who are part of the overall church, participating in adult worship services, rather than just attending ministries specific to their age group, are significantly more likely to continue an intentional faith into their young adult years and beyond.

We might also make a mistake in thinking that Junior High and High School students cannot understand the message in main service. This is surely just that, a mistake.

We often underestimate the strength of our kids' spiritual grasp. The Holy Spirit moves in the hearts of all believers during congregational worship—all hearts, the young and not-so-young!

Many two-hour families attend one service together. Then, when their kids go to their respective student environments, the parents serve for an hour in a ministry of their choosing. There are so many ways to get involved.



WE COMMIT TO SAFETY

We take the safety of your child seriously. We go to great lengths to provide an environment that is safe, stable, and healthy. Here are some of the ways we go about this.

Check-in System

All students participating in any church activity must be checked-in. All staff and volunteers must also be checked in and wear proper identification when serving with Current Students.

Adult Leader Requirements

All of our adult leaders and volunteers are vetted and background checked. They receive thorough on-boarding instruction as well as ongoing quarterly training. All adults complete child abuse awareness and prevention seminars before being allowed to serve.

All are made aware of our extensive, detailed policies on acceptable ways of ministering to youth which include: digital communication and social media etiquette, appropriate physical touch, off-campus interactions, transportation ethics, supervision, and much more. All of these policies can be made available to you upon request.



Illness and Injury


Serious injuries involving broken bones, fainting, unconsciousness, convulsions, or other serious bodily injury will be treated by the emergency medical team on campus or 911. Current Staff and volunteers are NOT authorized to dispense any over-the-counter or prescription medications.

Please keep your child home if they exhibit any of the following:

- Fever
- Vomiting and/or diarrhea
- Any obvious disease symptoms
- Sore throat, frequent cough
- Head lice
- Any skin or eye infection

Bullying

Bullying is more than just teasing or conflict. It is intentional, repeated behavior that causes physical, emotional, or social harm. It often includes a power imbalance and may be verbal, social, physical, or digital. Bullying is often disguised in jest.



If bullying is witnessed or reported at Current Students, we will take appropriate action. Our goal is to bring about grace-filled accountability and resolution followed by firm boundaries that maximize a safe and welcoming environment for all students.

Again, parents and the ministry staff are on the same team. Please keep us informed if you have concerns that your child is involved in any type of bullying. And likewise, we will keep you informed.

Suicide / Self-Harm

If a student expresses credible intent to harm themselves, it will be treated as an emergency. Our staff and volunteers are trained to respond in a way that is commensurate with the level of threat presented. Parents will always be made aware of credible self-harm threats or self-harm incidents that involve their child.

Mandatory Reporting

At Current – A Christian Church, the safety and well-being of every student in our ministry are our highest priority. We want to be completely transparent with you, the parent, about the procedures we have in place should we ever suspect child abuse.

Please know that everyone is legally required to report suspected child abuse under Texas law. This means that if any person believes a child is the victim of neglect, physical abuse, sexual abuse, or emotional abuse they are mandated to take the following steps:

- Immediate Reporting: The person must report their suspicions directly to: DFPS Texas Abuse Hotline at 1-800-252-5400. Then, to the Lead Minister overseeing that area.
- No Interviews: Volunteers are strictly prohibited from questioning the child about the suspected abuse. This is crucial because asking direct questions could unintentionally influence a child's statements.
- Strict Confidentiality: To protect the child and the integrity of any potential
 investigation, volunteers are not allowed to discuss suspected abuse with
 other volunteers, parents, or anyone else. All information will be kept
 confidential and shared only with the appropriate ministry leader and the
 proper authorities.
- Documentation: A volunteer may be asked to complete a Suspected Child
 Abuse Report form. We assure you that confidentiality will be maintained as
 much as possible throughout this process, and the form will be submitted to
 their ministry leader.

We share this information with you so you understand our commitment to creating a safe and secure environment for all children. Our policies are designed to ensure that any concerns are handled with the utmost care, professionalism, and in accordance with state laws.

Security

As a church, we make every effort possible to provide on-site security by uniformed police officers and/or trained security volunteers at all events.

Regular student programming and special events are no exception to this.

In the event of an emergency evacuation, students will be dismissed from the Summit into the grassy area near the south parking lot. If evacuation is not possible (in the event of an intruder / active shooter), trained volunteers will direct students to find a protected place to hide until law enforcement arrives on the scene.

Severe Weather

In the event of any weather warnings, such as severe thunderstorm or tornado warnings, leaders will move all children and volunteers into the Summit Auditorium. Everyone will remain in the Large Group room until the threat has passed.



CHRISTLIKE CONDUCT

We are committed to creating a Christcentered environment where every student is safe, respected, and equipped to grow in their faith.

To help protect that culture, we want to explain what we expect from all students during church events. Since we're a team, we want you to be aware of what we're asking from your child and what you can expect from us in return.

Be Present & Participate

We ask that students show up with a good attitude and a willingness to engage. This means respecting group times like worship, teaching, and small groups.

Speak Life

No bullying, teasing, name-calling, or gossip. Encourage one another and use language that reflects Christ. We want Current Students to be a place where outsiders feel like insiders, so we love to see students reach out to newcomers and those who might feel left out. We discourage cliques, exclusion, or behavior that causes division.

Be Respectful

All students must respect leaders, other students, and the space we use. We maintain a relaxed, collaborative environment but we expect that students will follow instructions and be mindful of leaders.

Technology Use

By default, we do not attempt to limit or control the use of electronic devices at Current Students events. Device use is permitted unless it becomes an impediment to the user or to others

Coaching and Correction

We know that all kids get off track from time to time. We accept this as part of spiritual growth and maturing in Christ. We handle undesirable behavior with grace, but we also believe in accountability. Our initial response will likely be informal, even lighthearted. If the behavior continues, a leader will address the problem with the student semi-privately and directly. It is extraordinarily rare for us to get beyond this point. But, our next step is to reach out to you in order to plan a course of improvement and resolution.

A JOURNEY WE TAKE TOGETHER

Life in Christ is not a solo hike, it's an adventure that requires all of us locking arms with one another! The "backpack" can get heavy on this journey, when there are issues and obstacles. Current Students is here to help carry some of the load, as your student learns to follow Jesus with passion, wisdom, and courage. We want to help create space for honest conversations, spiritual growth, and authentic community—both in your home and in this ministry.
